Retrieving Little Bits of History by Henry H. Brown, Huntsville, Texas

After purchasing our EAGLE II, my dad and I spent several days checking it out on gold and silver coins that we had buried in the yard. During the Christmas holidays, we had the chance to visit an old Civil War encampment, so we packed our gear, sleeping bags and groceries, and took off for South Texas. As soon as we got settled in, we contacted our longtime friend and fellow treasure hunter, Ray Penrod. We enjoy going hunting together looking for relics like old Civil War bottles, buttons, and similar things. After the first day, Christmas, we were pretty disappointed. We had set the EAGLE to accept everything. All we found was an old horseshoe and a short length of chain. Next day, we moved to another area about two miles away. After 15 minutes, we got a good hit that read 3 1/2 inches deep. We'd found a minnie ball! (A minnie ball is really a lead bullet that is shaped like a modern bullet, but the configuration is different). In all, we found 26 minnie balls, 3 flat metal buttons, 2 marble-shaped metal buttons, and a metal shield with an eagle on it. We also found 5 musket balls. All of these items were found at depths ranging from 2 1/2 to 9 inches deep. All were corroded, but in remarkably good shape after having been buried for some 130 years. These were all found in a "flat".

We decided to move on to a nearby rise the next day to resume our hunt. We took along a short-handled spade, thinking our digging would go faster. On the first sweep where the grass was short, the EAGLE signaled a good hit. At a little over six inches, we dug three minnie balls and a brass button. We also turned up some broken glass. On a hunch, we dug deeper and turned up an old liquor bottle and a small bottle later identified as an old ink bottle. This kind of find was repeated several times on that rise, turning up a number of minnie balls, pieces of chain, and a few more bottles, including two old crockery liquor bottles.

Before we finished searching that day, which was our last, we located iron buckles, old square nails, and various pieces of iron rings, chains and our favorite piece - an old belt buckle which has the letters "US" on it and which cleaned up beautifully.

In all, we found 97 minnie balls, 12 musket balls, 1 buckle, 7 old bottles, 1 shield, 8 ball-shaped buttons, 14 flat buttons (with eagle), and 1 marble.

Just as soon as we have another few days off, we're going to contact Ray again and head south again to search that rise, and hopefully come up with something that registers "gold or silver" on the EAGLE.

The "Gold" Coin by Timothy Dean Chapman, Huntington Beach, California

It was the second day of using my new White's EAGLE II SL. I was hunting in an old park about a mile from where I live. As I was familiarizing myself with my new detector and seemingly finding coins everywhere, I came to a target that registered in about the zinc penny range at 2 1/2 inches deep range. After pinpointing and finding the exact location of the target, I proceeded to probe the ground for the target. Sure enough, there it was. I carefully moved the grass over and pulled out the target. I couldn't believe my eyes. It was a gold coin, set in a pennant. After examining the coin in disbelief, I saw that it was a 1984 Australian gold coin. I put the coin in my pocket and kept searching. After finding a few more clad coins I decided it was time to go home and tell my wife about my terrific find. I showed her the coin and her first words were, "It can't be real". I proceeded to convince her that it had to be. I asked a number of other people, and I got some "maybe's" and some "no ways". I finally took the coin to a jeweler/coin shop to have it tested. I gave it to the man behind the counter. He looked at it very carefully, then tested it on a stone with some kind of chemical. Finally, with a stern voice he said, "it's fake, gold plated". I have to admit, my heart did drop a little.

Well, to look on the good side, I had a lot of fun finding it, and there are always more places to hunt. I have been a treasure hunter for over 18 years, and I'm only 27 years old. I have owned 7 different detectors and none of them even come close to this EAGLE II SL. It is by far the funnest, most challenging, and easiest-to-use detector I have ever owned.



Eleven Years with White's by George Schmitt, Pennsylvania



First of all, I would like to say that metal detecting is one of the things I enjoy most. Besides finding many valuables, I really enjoy the time spent on the hobby. I have made many friends and have many, many fond memories of metal detecting, not to mention the exercise.

I have been metal detecting with White's since December of 1978. I received one as a gift for Christmas. The EAGLE II is my fifth machine. I have owned a 4DB, 5000/D, 6000/D Series 2, 6000/D Series 3 and the EAGLE. I still have the 6000/Di 3 as a backup. I have never owned any other manufacturers brand, nor do I plan to.

Living in the upper most corner of Northeastern Pennsylvania, there are many old parks, churches, picnic grounds, ballfields and amusement areas to search.

The number one place for me has been summer camps. Wayne County alone has over 35 summer camps, some dating back to the turn of the century, most to the 1930's. Many of these camps are several hundred acres ... you can imagine the finds.

In my 11 years using White's machines, I have found more than 30,000 coins, more than 1,500 were silver. I have found all denominations of U.S. silver coins, except the three cent silver and twenty cent piece. Yes, I have a silver dollar - a 1926 D Peace dollar that I found three inches deep through an inch of snow at an old camp. I had been hunting the camp for

three years before I made this find with my 6000 D Series 2 in 1983.

I made thousands of great finds with my first four machines; seated dimes, Spanish 1 reales (the smaller ones about the size of a dime), seated quarters, high grade Barber coins, a 1795 Liberty Cop larger cent, a Connecticut larger cent dated 1786, many pieces of silver jewelry, gold class rings, just to name some!

I bought my EAGLE II in 1989. As with all of my machines, it took an outing or two to get accustomed to it (not that I still don't learn more all the time). I went back to many of the places I had been before; places others had been to as well.

In 1989, I found over one hundred silver coins at places that had been thoroughly searched by many, including me! I found silver thirty four times out of thirty seven trips. At one camp, which I have searched for eight years, I found another 26 silver coins, including an 1848 large date Liberty seated half dime, in excellent condition, and a man's gold class ring. Not bad, but still not the best.

I was invited to an old camp in neighboring New York state by a friend who recently became interested in the hobby. He also has an EAGLE II and since, has become one of your distributors. This camp had been searched for ten years. The pros said it was picked and indeed the pickings were slim, but there were pickings! Between the two of us, with our EAGLE's, we found twenty three silver coins - deep ones, including a 1918S standing Liberty quarter and two Walking Liberty halves, a '35 and a '36, each seven and a half inches deep. The coins were in an open area that others had searched and couldn't reach. Not bad, but still not the best.

There is one camp that I am the only one that has permission to search so, I figured this ought to be a good test for my ability and the EAGLE II. I'd searched the area many times with my other machines to the point where I could not find anymore coins. I did with the EAGLE. How about an XF 1912 Barber quarter dropped with an 1899 Indian Head penny seven inches down. The amazing thing is there was a pulltab four inches deep on top of them. Not bad, there's more. I started searching an area I had very little luck with previously, maybe one silver Roosevelt and a war 5 cent. There is a copper electric wire buried about eight inches across this section of the lawn. Working the lawn, the EAGLE detected the cable my other machines had previously found. Suddenly, my display jumped into the nickel reading. Checking my depth, there was something five inches down buried over this electric wire. The signal was too strong for nickel. I started thinking ring. I removed about four inches of dirt. It was still in the hole. I dug more, and there it was - a ring. Was it gold? I ran to a nearby puddle to wash it off. It sure was, 14K white gold, my size. In the middle was a 1/2 Carat diamond with two diamond chips. I raced to town to have a jeweler appraise it. \$1,500. Not bad!

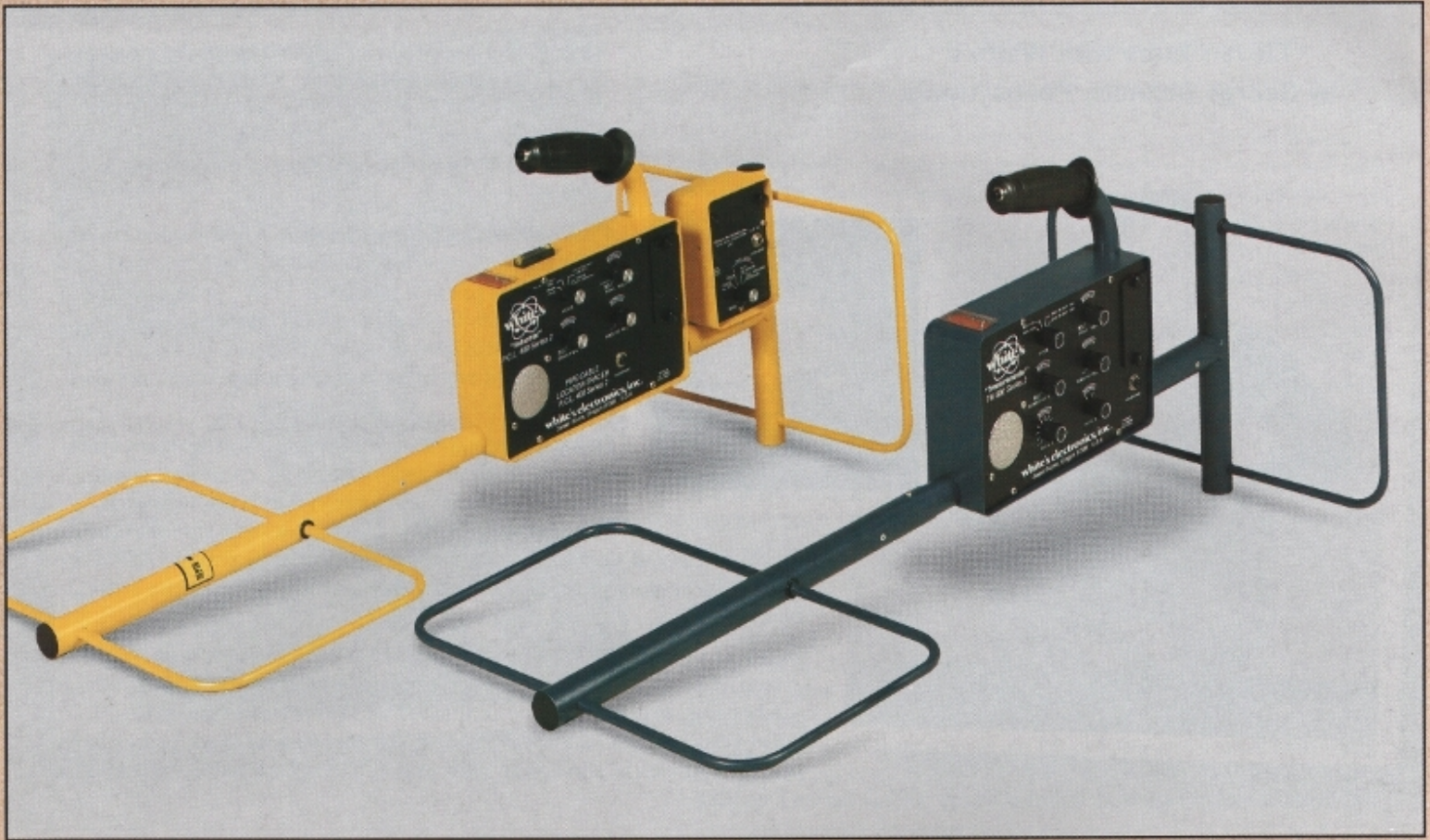

Well, White's Electronics, you have done it again ... or should I say you have outdone yourselves this time. Just when I think that I have the best metal detector anyone can make, you come up with a better one. I am referring to your new EAGLE II SL. The EAGLE is my third White's metal detector. My first was a Coinmaster 5D. I bought it in 1977. Then in 1983, I purchased a Coinmaster 6000/D Series II. I didn't think any other metal detector could top the performance of my 6000/D but the EAGLE II is the greatest. I have to admit I was very skeptical of the computer circuitry and buttons. I knew it had to be very complicated, hard to tune, etc. But was I wrong. I was surprised - it is actually one of the easiest metal detectors to operate. All you do is touch four spots on the touchpad and you're ready to start. You have come a long way from the Coinmaster 5D with its old ten turn controls. There is one thing that still bothers me about the EAGLE II SL. It makes everyone a professional when they use it. And it cleans out a sight so good that each time it's used, there is one less place to hunt.

I have had my EAGLE II SL for only a month, and everywhere I go where I had previously been with other metal detectors, I find more coins. Deeper coins, coins on edge, etc. The pinpointing and discrimination features are excellent. With the EAGLE II SL, I have found the best coin in my 15 years of metal detecting. It was December 29, 1989. I went to an old church about ten miles from my home. I wanted to use my new EAGLE II in an area I had been before and knew was cleaned out.

This old church was built in the mid-1800's but hasn't been used since the early 1930's. I searched the churchyard for 45 minutes and hadn't found anything yet. I thought for sure it was cleaned out. So I decided to search towards my truck and then leave for home. As I approached my truck I received a good signal. The EAGLE's meter read penny. The depth showed 3 1/2 inches. I carefully dug down to 3 inches and there standing on its edge was a penny. I pulled it out of the hole. It was a 1909S. I put it in my coin pouch and left for home. When I got home, I rinsed it off under the faucet. It was in excellent condition - full features as good as new, except for a dark green tint. I looked closer with a magnifying glass and I couldn't believe it, but there on the reverse as plain as day were the initials V.D.B. A local coin dealer valued it at \$350 - \$385. On January 6, 1990 I got out again in between the rain, and found a 1902 Quarter and a 1917S Mercury dime in another cleaned out site. Thank you for making a great metal detector and another thank you for opening up all the new sites for detecting. All my worked out sites are new again. The White's EAGLE II SL is the best.
